Resolution 75-2021

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and,

OLD BUSINESS

Mr. McBriar commented items one and two; at the last meeting draft ordinance were circulated for both items one and two. If members of the Council have looked at them and reviewed them; we should be able to put this on for the next agenda.

Mr. McBriar commented under new business Fire Marshal he requests we go into executive session to discuss that line item.

Administrative Fees for Recreation Areas and Facilities- see above. Amendments to Regulations for Municipal Recreation Areas – see above.

Swim Docks- Councilman Nardini commented you can take off the swim docks, there are going to come and inspect it but it will be a month or two. So, when that happens we will put that back on [the agenda].

Water Tank Cleaning – Councilman Nardini commented the water tank cleaning is on for 11/2 and 11/3 it is half days at the school; there is only going to be one tank cleaned at a time and a deeper inspection of the smaller tank. The school knows, DPW knows, water knows we should be good to go; there are additional pressure values being put in place so there is no interruption. Councilman Nardini commented he will put something on the board so everybody knows what is happening.

Water Rates – Councilman Nardini commented you can take this off. That is the ordinance we just passed [introduced].

Internet/emails – Councilman Nardini commented we can take this off for now. We do have a contact for Borough employees here on this level and he is working on getting a combined deal so the police can get the same benefit reduced rate and increased speed. DPW will also get a boost; if we can do all three at once we are trying to get a better deal to switch it.

NEW BUSINESS

Fire Marshall- Mayor Hutnick commented Mr. McBriar already mentioned the fire marshal.

Mayor Hutnick commented we are going to do a presentation to our senior of the year this Wednesday the 27th at the Fire House at 6:30 if anybody wishes to attend.

Mayor Hutnick commented the Borough Christmas Party is going to be December 12, Sunday at the fire house at one o'clock.

There was a discussion regarding the time. The party will be 11:00am to 2:00pm.

PUBLIC SESSION

Councilman Nardini moved, Councilman DeMeo seconded motion to open the public session of the meeting. All were in favor.

Mary Ann Collins, 150 Kennedy Ave., stepped forward to explain a problem they have with one of the neighbors. Our neighbor that lives at 55 Yurchak Road, his back yard is our back yard. He built a fire pit and loves burning wood and smoke to the point where we have a fog in our back yard. Ms. Collins commented she doesn't know exactly what he is burning but he is burning something that makes a lot of smoke. We both have conditions now with the smoke inhalation. We both go to a doctor and we are both taking medicine for it. We would like some help in trying to stop this from continuing. We have a presentation you can see, we took pictures and films of what has been happening and our neighbor Mr. Amodeo and Mr. Smith [are being affected].

Ms. Collins commented you said there is no code for this but maybe you can make a code; do something if you are really endangering other people there should be a code that doesn't allow that to happen. You have leaf burning rules but there is nothing about someone having a big fire pit and burning wet wood.

Cristian Zamfir, 150 Kennedy Ave., stepped forward with his computer and a presentation of pictures to show the Mayor and Council of the situation with the smoke. Mr. Zamfir showed the pictures and explained to the council what was happening.

Mayor Hutnick commented Council should know the reason the fire pit was built is because the person originally wanted to be a Brazilian chef for cooking meat on open fires.

Councilman Nasisi commented that's old it has been there for a long time it has stone. Mayor Hutnick commented he probably rebuilt the one that was there.

Mr. Zamfir continued to explain his presentation of photos. There was a discussion and Council asked Mr. Zamfir questions during his presentation.

Mayor Hutnick commented he had explained to you it is out of the town's hands, we have done a town investigation we have done fire and county investigations.

Mr. McBriar commented this is not the proper forum if you have a complaint with a neighbor and this is a private nuisance this isn't the appropriate forum to litigate this. You are saying a lot of hearsay statements Mr. McBriar commented we appreciate you coming here and sharing with the Council these photos and video. You indicated you tried to send this to Robin and it was bounced back he would encourage you to photo copy them and send them. Mr. McBriar commented he was copied on your email and he is reviewing it with the prosecutor. The Mayor and the County have looked at this in great detail. Generally, Municipalities don't get involved in private nosiness.

Mr. Zamfir commented we have a letter last year that was sent to the Council which is in the file when our neighbor Bill Amedo signed it. Mr. Zamfir explained the conditions that fire pit is causing.

Mr. McBriar asked Mr. Zamfir who he spoke to at the County. Mr. Zamfir commented Maureen Theese.

Mayor Hutnick commented he cannot walk up to him and say he can not burn we can't write an ordinance that specifically says you can't burn and you can't burn wet wood.

Mr. Zamfir commented he is burning garbage. Mayor Hutnick asked is he taking a bag of garbage out of his house and putting it in his firepit. Mr. Zamfir commented yes. Mayor Hutnick commented he is taking household trash in the garbage; do you have photos of that or is it pictures of him burning cardboard. Mr. Zamfir commented he has pictures of him burning the cardboard. Mayor Hutnick commented cardboard is allowed it is a fire started.

Mr. McBriar commented he thinks you should finish your presentation make sure the clerk receives the information you are showing us.

Mr. Zimphar continued with his presentation; council members asked questions.

Mayor Hutnick commented you and I have been going back and forth for over a year and a half [with this], we met in private had discussions sent emails back and forth we have the same topics and give you the same answers that never change. I have always offered to help you in any way I can but I have maximized what the town can do. With our legal representation already here and he has explained to you we will see if there is anything else we can do outside of the town boundaries.

There being no further business from the public, Councilwoman Slater moved, Councilman DeMeo seconded motion to close the public session of the meeting. All were in favor.
