**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Ogdensburg ("Grantor") is the owner of certain real property situated in the Borough of Ogdensburg, Sussex County, New Jersey, and identified on the Borough Tax Maps as Block 2, Lots 1 and 12.01 (collectively "Grantor's Property"); and

**WHEREAS**, James Lame ("Grantee") is the owner of certain real property situated in the Borough of Ogdensburg, Sussex County, New Jersey, and identified on the Borough Tax Maps as Block 2, Lots 7 and 8 (collectively "Grantee's Property"); and

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2024, Grantor granted Grantee a Limited Non-Exclusive Access Easement ("Easement") to allow Grantee lawful ingress and egress to Grantee's Property from Edison Road across a portion of Grantor's Property, subject to certain rights, responsibilities, terms, and conditions set forth in said Easement which was duly recorded in the Sussex County Clerk's Office ("Clerk's Office") on June 10, 2024, in Book 10316, Page 861; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 4, 2024, Grantee filed an application with the Borough of Ogdensburg Land Use Board ("Land Use Board") seeking bulk variance relief and related approvals required to construct a single-family, two-story dwelling, pole barn, and other associated amenities on Grantee's Property ("Application No. LUB 07-2024"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Land Use Board approved Application No. LUB 07-2024 on December 10, 2024, and memorialized said approval by way of written resolution dated January 28, 2025, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, due to uneven topography and unforeseen site conditions materially affecting Grantee's Property and access thereto, as well as prior width constraints and limitations dictating placement of utilities, Grantee has formally requested that the Easement be amended to more reasonably accommodate the approved development of Grantee's Property as generally depicted in the "Lot Consolidation/Lot Development Plans Block 2, Lots 7 & 8, #140 Edison Avenue, Ogdensburg, Sussex County - New Jersey," prepared by Kenneth D. Dykstra, P.E., of Dykstra Walker Design Group, P.A., dated October 24, 2024, last revised May 30, 2025 and corresponding "Description of an Access, Drainage & Utility Easement Across Lots 1 & 12.01 – Block 2 Lots 7 & 8 – Block 2 Borough of Ogdensburg, Sussex County, New Jersey, dated March 11, 2025, last revised May 30, 2025 copies of which are attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and two members of the Governing Body inspected Grantee's Property accompanied by the Grantee and Borough Engineer on April 22, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governing Body has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough and the public to amend the Easement as set forth more particularly in the Amended Limited Non-Exclusive Access, Drainage and Utility Easement ("Amended Easement") attached hereto; and

#### Resolution 59-2025

**WHEREAS,** the State of New Jersey has appropriated \$6 million for Shared Services and Implementation, Challenge, and County Coordinator Grants to assist local units with the study, development, and implementation of new shared and regional services; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) is tasked with administering these grant funds through the Local Efficiency Achievement Program (LEAP); and

WHEREAS, LEAP Implementation Grants exist to support costs associated with shared service implementation to ensure that meaningful, efficiency generating initiatives are not hindered by short term transitional expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Vernon, the Township of Lafayette, the Township of Hardyston, The Borough of Hamburg, the Borough of Franklin, the township of Montague, and the Borough of Ogdensburg have entered into shared services agreement, but face certain expenses associated with implementation that present a burden to the local units; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of these shared services agreements is to provide animal control services, which involve providing temporary housing for animals collected in the course of the agreement;

WHEREAS, it is ideal to have a quarantine unit for newly retrieved animals to mitigate any spread of communicable diseases within the shelter population, this agreement would allow for the construction of new quarantine units in the Vernon Animal Shelter, which will benefit the residents of all participating local units; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Vernon has agreed to be the lead agency in this program and will submit the application to DLGS on behalf of all participating units; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has made LEAP grants available to assist local units to study, develop and implement new shared services initiatives; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the <u>Borough of Ogdensburg</u> does hereby join with the Township of Vernon in applying for a LEAP Implementation Grant in the amount of \$213,750 to support implementation of this shared service.

We mentioned at a meeting before that the lead line water reports the State is requiring was in the middle of changing. Robin received a webinar request with a couple dates which is impossible for her to do. So, she sent in email to the State asking for the forms.

Ms. Hough explained she received an email today there is another webinar that is being offered which is actually credits for the water operator. It's not for clerk it is for the water operator. Ms. Hough explained she signed up for the webinar; it supposed to show you how to report on line. Ms. Hough explained she wanted the Council to know it is supposed to be the water operator.

Councilman Ciasullo asked are they saying now he is responsible for the forms?

Ms. Hough explained when she goes to clerks' classes for updates on her responsibilities; raffles, ABC licensing she get credits for it. This class is a credit for the water operator not a clerk. That tells her that it is not a clerk's job. She signed up for it because we need to get this done; in other towns it is the water operator that does this.

Mayor Hutnick commented this isn't listed as a clerk's responsibility.

Councilwoman Ruitenberg commented you doing it and knowing what the process is, is a great thing because then you can help us make sure everything gets done. It doesn't fall on you; it falls on the water operator to do it.

Councilman Ciasullo commented I hear you but let's go backwards for a minute. We have been through all this before; he looked into it at the time it could have changed. At the time it didn't fall on the water operator as far as his responsibility.

There was a discussion on who is responsible for the lead line reporting.

Councilwoman Ruitenberg had nothing to report.

Councilman DeMeo had nothing to report regarding the fire department. Councilman DeMeo explained we applied for a fire department grant for equipment. The grant writers suggested applying for it. It is ten thousand dollars for equipment. The Chief went through the list of eligible equipment and the grant writers filed it.

Mayor Hutnick reported on the police department. The trainees are doing well, they are on the road and the training is continuing.

Councilwoman Cowdrick reported the lake is open the guards have been up there; we are going to open seven days a week on the 14<sup>th</sup>.

Councilwoman Ruitenberg asked if we were getting mulch for the park for the fire house.

There was a brief discussion on mulch, last year the scout moved all the mulch as one of their projects and we don't need as much as last year.

Councilwoman Lame reported on replacing the door in borough hall; Jake from DPW said they can take care of it. She did reach out to a couple of people and they aren't interested; she

believed Councilman Gandarinho also did and no one was interested. Jake said he will take care of it; he is going to get the information on the door.

Councilwoman Lame reported we are having Ogdensburg Day this Saturday, on the 12<sup>th</sup> we are having a volunteer meeting. They are looking for volunteers to help with the day full of activities. Councilwoman Lame explained the different activities.

Mayor Hutnick asked about having an additional port a john for the event.

There was a discussion on the port a john needed for Ogdensburg Day.

Councilman Gandarinho reported on Municipal Alliance; he is discussing with Dave Astor dates for next year for teen canteen where we are going to host it. Also, we are looking for individuals to john the drug alliance committee.

Councilman Gandarinho reported he spoke to Jake on Friday; with all the rain they are maintaining the ballfields right now; he has a couple of projects with manhole sinking on Adams and Washington and explained the project.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Resident follow ups – Councilwoman Cowdrick explained after the last meeting she reached out to JCP&L regarding Jim Lame and his issue with his property. She contacted someone; we had a conference call with Jim and that person, it has been expedited to another layout tech. That person has taken control of his account because apparently the person that was running it is on vacation/leave and never handed it off to the next person. We have a meeting scheduled for Wednesday.

Councilwoman Cowdrick explained as far as the residents that have come forward with possible property damage from the Quarry. Councilwoman Cowdrick and Mayor Hutnick met with Braen today, we showed them the pictures and explained the issue residents were having. They were very understanding and willing to help. They asked for a list of people affected, name and number to put them on a list to get the calls when they are going to blast and so they can reach out to them personally, come to your properties to see what is going on. They are going to put a monitor in Mr. Taylor's yard if that is ok.

Mayor Hutnick explained what Braen is planning on doing is to reach out to the people on the list; you are welcome to contact Braen directly. They want to come talk to you, schedule a visit and let you know when they are going to blast and explained a monitor for the properties to get readings.

Senior of the year – Mayor Hutnick asked if we have any names.

Councilwoman Ruitenberg commented she received a recommendation.

Mayor Hutnick commented he has also received one.

Why don't you hire the applicant that was on time with his application tonight so he can get to work? Repost the job and the gentleman that was late can apply early. Ms. Schroder spoke about being short staff and we need to figure out a way to fix it, not only in this building but in DPW.

Julie Diaz, Ogdensburg explained to make sure someone doesn't do something different from what they say and gave her concerns.

William Colon, Ogdensburg spoke about the blasting.

Julie Diaz, Ogdensburg spoke about the damage in her house; damage in her home the foundation and land is sinking.

Cristain Zamfir, Ogdensburg spoke about Braen monitoring the homes and his chimney is dislocated.

Julie Diaz, Ogdensburg explained we need someone we can trust.

Donna Heverly, Ogdensburg asked about why the Mine sign is gone.

Mayor Hutnick explained the violation the Borough received from the State and the reason why the sign is no longer there.

Eric Schmidal, Ogdensburg spoke about the traffic on Route 517, accidents at the top of Glenbrook Road and gave some suggestions on this dangerous area and possible signs to put up.

Councilman Ciasullo explained a study of this area that was done in the past.

Donna Heverly, Ogdensburg spoke about the amount of cars parked on that corner of Glenbrook road at the gas station,

Suzann Brush, Ogdensburg, spoke about DPW needing help now not in a couple of weeks when everybody decides to be done bickering. You have an applicant that submitted the application on time why aren't you moving forward you are delaying this for someone that was late. Ms. Brush asked how long will this person be employed and how long will it take you guys to make a decision.

Kris Gordon, Ogdensburg asked Mr. Becker on Bridge Street couldn't make the meeting tonight but was aware the bridge was brought up. He was wondering if we had the names of the contacts from the County so he could follow up with them.

Councilwoman Ruitenberg commented she will email them to you tonight.
